No trash delay for Presidents' Day holiday

The upcoming Presidents' Day holiday on Monday, February 19 will not impact refuse collection in any of MMWA's member communities. Residents should put their materials to the curb on their regular collection day.

The list of holidays that do impact solid waste pickup are: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Any communities with service that falls on the holiday and those that are serviced on the weekdays after the holiday will have collection delayed by one day.

Service is not impacted when the holiday falls on a weekend.

As soon as the HSW drop-off schedule is confirmed and all program details are in place, it will be posted and promoted.
